Manatee County Emergency Management is monitoring Hurricane Irma. The EOC is at a Level 2 (Partial Activation) status. A mandatory briefing will be held at 8:30 a.m., Wednesday, September 6, in the EOC, at which time the EOC will go to Level 1 activation, 0800 – 2000 until further notice and then it will be in a locked down status. This briefing will provide the status of Hurricane Irma and a forum to gather any protective measures and unmet needs in anticipation of impacts from Hurricane Irma.

A WebEOC event is pending for Hurricane Irma.

For the North Atlantic...Caribbean Sea and the Gulf of Mexico:

The National Hurricane Center is issuing advisories on Hurricane Irma, located a couple hundred miles east of the Leeward Islands.

1. Showers and thunderstorms associated with an area of low pressure located about 1000 miles west-southwest of the Cabo Verde Islands are gradually becoming better organized. Conditions appear conducive for continued development of this system. There is a high likelihood that a tropical depression or tropical storm will form within the next day or two while the disturbance moves west-northwestward at 10 to 15 mph over the tropical Atlantic Ocean.

- * Formation chance through 48 hours...high...80 percent.
- * Formation chance through 5 days...high...90 percent.
- 2. A trough of low pressure located over the southwestern Gulf of Mexico is producing numerous showers and thunderstorms. Environmental conditions are conducive for gradual development, and this system is likely to become a tropical depression during the next couple of days while it meanders over the southwestern Gulf of Mexico. Regardless of development, heavy rains associated with this disturbance are likely over portions of eastern Mexico during the remainder of the week.
- * Formation chance through 48 hours...medium...60 percent.
- * Formation chance through 5 days...high...70 percent.

Detailed Forecast

Today

Scattered showers and thunderstorms, mainly between 2pm and 5pm. Partly sunny, with a high near 90. Heat index values as high as 100. Southeast wind 5 to 7 mph becoming west in the afternoon. Chance of precipitation is 30%.

Tonight

Isolated showers and thunderstorms before 8pm. Mostly cloudy, with a low around 77. North northwest wind around 6 mph becoming east southeast after midnight. Chance of precipitation is 10%.

Wednesday

Scattered showers and thunderstorms, mainly after 11am. Mostly cloudy, with a high near 89. Heat index values as high as 99. East southeast wind 5 to 7 mph becoming west in the afternoon. Chance of precipitation is 30%.

Wednesday Night

Isolated showers and thunderstorms before 2am. Mostly cloudy, with a low around 77. North northwest wind around 6 mph becoming east northeast after midnight. Chance of precipitation is 20%.

Thursday

Scattered showers and thunderstorms, mainly after 2pm. Mostly cloudy, with a high near 91. North wind around 6 mph. Chance of precipitation is 40%.

Thursday Night

Scattered showers and thunderstorms. Mostly cloudy, with a low around 77. East northeast wind around 8 mph. Chance of precipitation is 30%.

Friday

Scattered showers and thunderstorms. Partly sunny, with a high near 90. Northeast wind around 10 mph. Chance of precipitation is 50%.

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Friday Night

Isolated showers and thunderstorms. Mostly cloudy, with a low around 78. Breezy, with a northeast wind around 15 mph, with gusts as high as 21 mph. Chance of precipitation is 20%.

Saturday

Scattered showers and thunderstorms. Partly sunny, with a high near 89. Windy, with a northeast wind 16 to 21 mph, with gusts as high as 30 mph. Chance of precipitation is 50%.

Saturday Night

Scattered showers and thunderstorms. Mostly cloudy, with a low around 78. Windy. Chance of precipitation is 40%.

Sunday

Showers likely and possibly a thunderstorm. Cloudy, with a high near 85. Windy. Chance of precipitation is 60%.

Sunday Night

Showers likely and possibly a thunderstorm. Cloudy, with a low around 76. Very windy. Chance of precipitation is 60%.

Monday

Scattered showers and thunderstorms. Mostly cloudy, with a high near 84. Windy. Chance of precipitation is 50%.

Citizens
